

Summary of FHN Code Plans

<u>Code 100</u>	an influx of a large number of victims from a natural or man-made disaster. Visitors may be asked to leave the hospital. Incident Command will be responsible for delegation of duties and personnel pool. Unit staff members will assist by directing the victim's family members to a designated meeting room. Security will be responsible for controlling access to the Hospital as well as monitoring the emergency room and triage areas.
<u>Code Blue</u>	a condition in which circulation or respiration is either absent or inadequate to sustain life. On main campus Dial 4, off-campus sites Dial 9-1-1, & begin CPR.
<u>Code Red</u>	a fire or fire alarm. Use R-A-C-E and P-A-S-S! Patients & staff should leave the building and meet at their designated meeting place. Designated meeting place for my office/department is _____ (find out from your leader)
<u>Code Orange</u>	a bomb threat. If a device is found, Law Enforcement will contact the proper agencies to facilitate the removal of the device. Evacuate the building as needed. See code plan attachment with plan for documenting caller characteristics.
<u>Code Black</u>	a tornado warning (tornado has been sighted) been reported. Patients and staff are directed to an inside windowless room (bathroom or medication room) or the basement if available. Designated room/area for my office/dept. is _____.
<u>Code Gray</u>	is called when severe weather has been reported (storms, tornado, blizzard etc.). Staff is alerted to the conditions and can make decisions for the care and safety of our patients, visitors, and fellow team members.
<u>Code Silver</u>	(Active Shooter Response) is an emergency response that will minimize potential risk in the event of a person <u>using or brandishing</u> a weapon at an FHN facility, and to assist law enforcement in locating and neutralizing the threat.
<u>Code 25</u>	an immediate need for Security where person(s) are displaying threatening or improper behavior. Staff may call 9-1-1 if they deem it necessary. A <u>CODE 25W</u> is when the person involved is armed. A <u>CODE 25H</u> is called when there is a Hostage situation.
<u>Code Green</u>	a person in need of medical assistance. Stay with person until assistance arrives. In outlying areas call 9-1-1 if additional help is needed.
<u>Code Zero</u>	a lockdown of a department due to the need for extraordinary security measures. Entry into the area will be controlled. Law Enforcement may be called to assist in crowd/visitor control during a Code Zero.
<u>Code Purple</u>	an infant or child abduction. Review full plan for department specific roles in monitoring doors and responsibilities related to abduction. Law Enforcement will be summoned and involved immediately.
<u>Code Yellow</u>	an internal/external disaster plan for managing person(s) contaminated with a hazardous material. Designated staff members are trained to handle or work with other agencies to handle such disasters. Isolate the person(s) and wait for instructions as to how to proceed further.
<u>Rapid Response</u>	is the call for patients whose medical condition is deteriorating. Rapid Response Team (Nursing/Respiratory) responds. Attending physicians will be notified by staff if patient under their care.
